The Irving and Phyllis Millstein Foundation for Animal Welfare® is a nonprofit corporation and a tax-free foundation, pursuant to section 501(c)(3) of the U. S. Internal Revenue Code. The Foundation supports animal welfare organizations and animal-based services in New York City, Long Island, Illinois, Greater Philadelphia and Greater Burlington (Vermont). Grantmaking has also been extended to several specific charities in Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and the District of Columbia. Regional representatives are experienced in both grantmaking and foundation corporate management. Applying for a grant is by invitation only.

The Foundation's philanthropy adheres to strict standards and procedures. Grants are made in several charitable giving areas: general or veterinary animal care, disaster relief, capital reinvestment and expansion, and training and education. In each aforementioned geographic region, the Foundation sponsors low-cost veterinary care through the Millstein MVP® Vaccination Program and the Millstein MVP® Spay and Neuter Program. The Foundation also issues grants for program support and shelter capital redevelopment.

The Irving and Phyllis Millstein Foundation's core mission as an animal-centered philanthropy is to serve the needs of both animal and human populations. Foundation representatives work to create the most effective solutions for high-quality animal care, and at the same time, promote and help preserve the valuable bonds between owners and their animals.

The Foundation's programs and support also encourage meaningful and lasting relationships with animal welfare proponents that yield valuable insights into emerging needs, industry trends and regional differences in animal care. A continuing review of grant proposals and programs across regions ensures alignment with the Foundation's mission and long-term goals.
